

IAAF World Indoor Championship - 2006



The first Dominican highlight on the Track and Field World Stage in 2006 is Chris Lloyd's qualification to the IAAF World Indoor Championship in the 400m event.

For the first time in his young career he has achieved the IAAF "A" Standard (47.10) in a time of 46.99. His goal is to make the finals at this year's WIC, which will be held in Moscow, Russia from the 10th - 12th March.

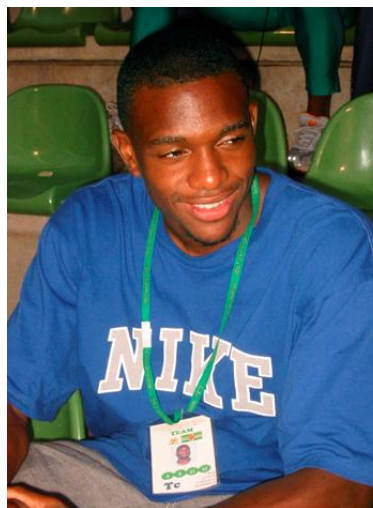
Immediately after the WIC he will travel to the Commonwealth Games to represent Dominica in Melbourne, Australia, from the 15th - 26th March.

It appears that the change of coach for this new season is showing positive signs towards achieving his big aim, which is to be placed in the top ten 400m runners in the near future.

Chris Lloyd, born in Texas (1980) of Dominican parents from Castle Bruce, first represented Dominica 4 years ago at the Commonwealth Games in Manchester. He then went on to the Pan-Am Games (Santo Domingo) and CAC Senior Championship (Grenada) in 2003. He met the International Association of Athletic Federation's qualifying B standard for the World Outdoor Championship (Paris) in 2003 and the World Indoor Championship (Hungary) in 2004.

Chris was Dominica's only qualified athlete at the Olympic Games 2004 in Athens (B standard).

In 2005 he qualified for the CAC Championship and was the only athlete selected to participate at the IAAF World Championship in Helsinki Finland, in August 2005 based on his consistent good results.
